During the third quarter of 2025 our Kennewick Officers utilized the Community Care Fund 12 times, helping 23 individuals. A summary of some of these situations include:

- Heat pump service for an elderly woman
- Hotel for a family who lost home due to loss of job
- Hotel for homeless mother and daughter
- Assistance for a family after residential fire
- Assistance to a sexual assault victim

3rd Quarter Community Events

During the third quarter of 2025, our Foundation convened its monthly board meetings, and we extend our sincere gratitude to Ranch and Home for graciously hosting these gatherings. Throughout this period, the Foundation actively participated in and supported a variety of events, including:

- **Fire of Fire (4th of July)** - Officers worked along the Fire Department to make a safe celebration.
- **Waterfollies** - Officers, Fire Department, other city departments and regional law enforcement partners work together to provide safety for the family friendly event.
- **Kona Ice** - Free snow cones to Kennewick Boys & Girls Club, B5 Learning Center and neighboring apartments.
- **Superhero Day at the Boy & Girls Kennewick Club** - Officers were invited to the club to celebrate the day with the club members.
- **National Night Out** - The event promotes police/community partnerships, encourages neighborhood camaraderie to strengthen relationships between residents and law enforcement. It also raises awareness about crime prevention and safety programs.
- **Department Active Shooter Training**. The officers who participated gained valuable and realistic training to prepare them if such an event occurs. The training was conducted at Bethlehem Lutheran School.
- **Boys & Girls Kennewick Club Carnival Family Night** - The KPD Foundation once again supported the back-to-school supplies and free haircuts at no cost to the club members. The Foundation partnered with Legacy Barbershop and provided 55 haircuts boys who otherwise have never had access to a barber.
- **Benton Franklin County Fair** - KPD officers worked with regional partners to ensure everyone could safely enjoy “The Best Week of Summer”.
- **Coffee with a Cop** - Officers met kids and community members at Columbia Ability Alliance
- **Detective Keith Schwartz retirement** - He retired after 23 years of service to the citizens of Kennewick.
